REFLECTION

This week, we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In this section, he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.



SAINT ALOYSIUS GONZAGA



Aloysius Gonzaga was born in 1568. Born a prince, in Lombardy, Aloysius began to practice prayer and penance at a young age, rejecting the values of his position and family. St. Charles Borromeo gave him his first Holy Communion. Against great resistance, in 1585 he gave up his rights as eldest son and joined the Jesuits, hoping to go to the missions. Instead, in 1591 the plague broke out in Rome, and Aloysius offered himself to serve the sick and dying in the hospital. He caught the plague and died three months later, at just 23 years old. He was canonized in 1726. His feast day is

June 21 and he is the patron saint of young men.

“VOS ESTIS LUX MUNDI” ISSUED BY POPE FRANCIS

This document clarifies issues about reporting allegations of abuse procedures and accountability within the Church, and it demonstrates Pope Francis' commitment to amend the Code of Canon Law with the inclusion of serious measures to protect the most vulnerable from sexual abuse. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops welcomes these new norms as the Church's response "to prevent and combat these crimes that betray the trust of the faithful". The CCCB will study the new norms and take the necessary steps to ensure that Bishops are properly informed so that they may implement them in their dioceses/eparchies in a manner which complements and enhances the 2018 CCCB Guidelines.
