CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S MASSES

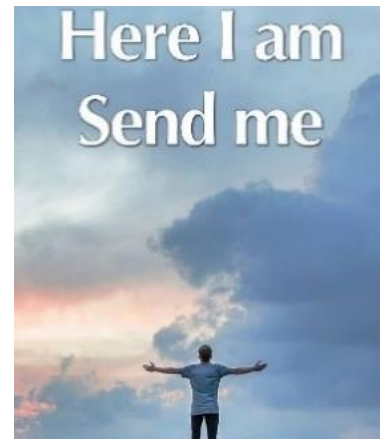
No decisions regarding Christmas Masses will be made until late November. Registering for Masses will be possible beginning early December. Thank you for your patience.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

In his reflection on this special day, Pope Francis said: “In this year marked by the suffering and challenges created by the Covid-19 pandemic, the missionary journey of the whole Church continues in light of the words found in the account of the calling of the prophet Isaiah: “Here am I, send me” (6:8). This is the ever-new response to the Lord’s question: “Whom shall I send?”. This invitation from God’s merciful heart challenges both the Church and humanity as a whole in the current world crisis... The call to mission, the invitation to step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbour presents itself as an opportunity for sharing, service and intercessory prayer. The mission that God entrusts to each one of us leads us from fear and introspection to a renewed realization that we find ourselves precisely when we give ourselves to others... The celebration of World Mission Day is an occasion for reaffirming how prayer, reflection and the material help of your offerings are so many opportunities to participate actively in the mission of Jesus in his Church”.



Archbishop Protase Rugambwa, Secretary of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, says "The missionaries are there, alongside those who suffer, all the more with the impact of the global crisis. This is a favorable moment for the mission: we are called today to announce and give the love of God above all where there is suffering, misery, despair".

All parishes and dioceses contribute to the universal solidarity fund which is then shared among countries according to their need. In 2020, a special Emergency Fund was set up by Pope Francis for the Pontifical Mission Societies to help the communities affected by Covid-19. 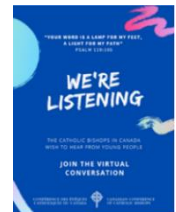
