REFLECTION

Pope Francis' [message](#) for the 4th World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, entitled "***Do Not Cast Me Off In My Old Age***" (Ps 71:9), invites us to reflect deeply on the place of the elderly in our lives and in society. He reminds us that old age is often "a blessing" and that God always remains close. The Holy Father draws attention to the unjust loneliness of the elderly, exacerbated by socio-economic factors, conflict and cultural prejudice. He calls for an urgent and compassionate response to the isolation of the elderly, stressing that their marginalization is a painful reality that requires concrete action. Our attention is also drawn to the importance of intergenerational unity, rejecting the idea that the elderly are a burden on society. On the contrary, the Holy Father sees them as cornerstones, rich in wisdom and experience. He calls for a culture of encounter and fraternity, where young and old support each other. By caring for our elders, we honor their dignity and enrich our own humanity.
