October 7th is the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. We are reminded of the power of prayer and the tender guidance of our Blessed Mother. Through the Rosary, we meditate on the life of Christ with Mary, who always leads us closer to her Son.



Gospel Reflection

The first part of this week's Gospel examines our attitude toward relationships. First, the Pharisees test Jesus with a question about divorce, and He responds by emphasizing that God's intent for marriage was unity, but divorce became necessary due to people's hard-heartedness. Jesus highlights that broken relationships stem from a lack of commitment and sin. urging us to reflect on how our hearts impact our relationships.

The second part of the Gospel, where Jesus blesses children, shows the importance of approaching life and relationships with humility, openness, and vulnerability—qualities children naturally possess. Jesus connects these two teachings, reminding us that a soft heart, capable of love, grace, and wonder, is essential for healthy relationships and living according to God's will. His message challenges us to examine whether our hearts are hard or open to love and reconciliation.




