Gospel Reflection

In Mark 10:46-52, we encounter Bartimaeus, a blind This story speaks powerfully of faith, courage, beggar who calls out to Jesus as He passes by, boldly and the transformative mercy of God. addressing Him as "Son of David," a title of deep faith that acknowledges Jesus as the promised Messiah. Despite the crowd's attempts to silence him, Bartimaeus cries out even louder, undeterred by rejection or judgment. His determination catches Jesus' attention, and He stops, calling Bartimaeus forward. When Jesus asks, "What do you want me to He asks us, "What do you want me to do for do for you?" Bartimaeus responds with remarkable clarity: "Rabbi, I want to see." Jesus recognizes his faith and grants his request, saying, "Your faith has healed you." Immediately, Bartimaeus receives his sight and chooses to follow Jesus on the way.
