Gospel Reflection

In Mark 12:28-34, we encounter a profound exchange between Jesus and a scribe who seeks to understand the essence of the law. The scribe asks, "Which commandment is the greatest of all?" Jesus responds with a powerful declaration: to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

This passage emphasizes the foundational principles of our faith—love for God and love for others. It invites us to examine the depth of our love, urging us to commit fully to God and extend that love to those around us. By loving God above all, we align ourselves with His will, allowing His

love to transform our hearts. This transformation enables us to overcome resentfulness, contempt, and loathing, fostering a spirit of compassion and kindness.

As we reflect on these verses, we are challenged to prioritize love in our lives. It is not merely a feeling but an active choice to engage with the world around us in a manner that mirrors God's love for us. Let us strive to embody this dual commandment daily, knowing that in loving God and our neighbours, we fulfill the very heart of the Gospel.


