

Memorial of St. Peter Damian

Reformist, Scholarly, Devout

St. Peter Damian (1007-1072) was a Benedictine monk, bishop, and Doctor of the Church known for his efforts to reform the clergy and monastic life. A brilliant scholar and theologian, he wrote extensively on Church discipline, promoting holiness and moral integrity among priests and religious. Despite his love for solitude, he was called to serve as a papal advisor, working tirelessly to combat corruption and restore spiritual fervor. His deep devotion to Christ and the Church shaped his writings and

reforms, many of which influenced

later Church teachings. Honored as a

At an estimated cost of \$150,000, this project would beautify our church in time for its 160th anniversary and serve as a step forward in Project 2033, preparing our parish for the future. We are pleased to share that over 20% of the total has already been pledged, even before formal fundraising has begun.




