September 3 St. Gregory the Great

St. Gregory the Great, pope and Doctor the Church. remembered as one of the most influential leaders in Christian history. Born into a wealthy Roman family, he gave up privilege to embrace the monastic life, desiring only to serve God in prayer and simplicity. Yet, when called to lead the Church, he accepted the papacy with humility and became known as a true shepherd of souls.

Gregory worked tirelessly to reform the liturgy and promote the singing of sacred chant that still bears his name today. His writings, especially Pastoral Care, continue to guide priests and lay leaders alike. Deeply concerned for the poor,


