known as Gaudete Sunday, takes its name from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice," reminding us that joy is at the heart of this celebration as Christmas draws near. Rose vestments are worn to highlight this spirit of joyful anticipation, and the rose candle on our Advent wreath is lit as a sign of hope and light breaking into the darkness. This joy is deepened by the beginning of the O Antiphons, a rich and reflective part of the Advent season. These ancient prayers, each beginning with the word "O," invite us to deepen our longing for Christ's arrival. Each antiphon calls on a different title of the Messiah, such as "O Wisdom" or "O Lord of Might," offering a poignant way to meditate on His coming. Find this week's O Antiphon prayers inside, and let them help focus your prayers this Advent as we rejoice in the nearness of the Savior and ready our lives to receive Him.
