## Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins his public ministry not in the safety of Jerusalem, but in Galilee, a place marked by obscurity and struggle. Matthew is careful to tell us that this move fulfills Isaiah's prophecy: a people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Jesus does not wait for perfect conditions or prepared hearts. He enters ordinary life and announces a simple but demanding call: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." This call is not about shame or fear. Repentance means turning, reorienting our lives toward the light now standing before us. As the psalm reminds us, "The Lord is my light and my salvation." To follow Christ is to step out of the shadows that limit us and trust that his presence changes everything.

Jesus then calls fishermen who are busy, rooted, and unremarkable. They leave their nets immediately, not because they understand everything, but because they recognize authority spoken with love. Saint Paul echoes this urgency when he urges the Corinthians to stop dividing themselves and to be united in Christ. The Gospel ends with Jesus teaching, proclaiming, and healing. Where Christ is welcomed, darkness gives way to joy, unity, and hope. Today, the same invitation is extended to us: turn toward the light, and follow.

### An Invitation to Register with the Parish



### January 26 Saints Timothy and Titus

This week the Church celebrates Saints Timothy and Titus, close companions of Saint Paul and leaders in the early Church. Entrusted with guiding young Christian communities, they were responsible for teaching the faith, strengthening believers, and helping build stable foundations for the growing Church.

What makes Timothy and Titus especially relatable is that they were not apostles in the dramatic sense, but steady servants who carried the faith forward through perseverance and trust in God. Their example reminds us that building the Church often happens through quiet faithfulness, consistency, and a willingness to take responsibility for the good of the community.

As we remember Saints Timothy and Titus, we are invited to reflect on our own role in passing on the faith. Whether through teaching, volunteering, encouragement, or simply living the Gospel in daily life, each of us is called to be a trustworthy steward of the faith we have received.

## Volunteer Opportunities

The Children's Liturgy Program at St. Patrick's is in need of several adult volunteers. We are hoping to expand the program, so that it offered a both the 9am and the 11am Sunday Masses. We have a well established program, with lots of resources. The current leaders will help train all new volunteers. The 11am Mass program will begin as soon as there are enough volunteers (min. 4 adults), hopefully this spring. The team at the 9am Mass will be stepping down in June, and so we will need a new team in place by September. However, we are happy to add new volunteers to the current schedule. At this time, we do not need any teen volunteers. Volunteers do not need teaching experience, although Teachers' College students and recent graduates are most welcome. A willingness to share the Gospel with children, ages 3 - 9, is all that is needed. ## St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the Church

Saint Thomas's example reminds us that faith and intellect are gifts to be used in the service of God and others. We are invited to grow in knowledge, reflection, and prayer, seeking always to live our faith with both wisdom and devotion, and to share the light of Christ in our words and actions.


## Sunday of the Word of God

Today the Church celebrates the Sunday of the Word of God, a day established by Pope Francis to draw our attention to the central place Sacred Scripture holds in the life of the Church and in our daily lives as Christians. This Sunday reminds us that the Word of God is not only proclaimed at Mass, but is meant to be listened to, prayed with, and lived.

The Scriptures are how God continues to speak to His people. Through them, we come to know Christ more deeply, to understand God's mercy and call, and to be shaped as disciples. When the Word is proclaimed, it is not simply recalling something from the past. It is God addressing us here and now, offering guidance, comfort, challenge, and hope.

For us as listeners, this day is an invitation. An invitation to listen more attentively at

Mass, to open the Scriptures at home, and to allow God's Word to take root in our hearts. Even a small habit, such as reflecting on the Sunday readings during the week or reading a short passage each day, can deepen our relationship with God. As we celebrate this Sunday, may we grow in love for the Word of God, recognizing it as a living gift that strengthens our faith and guides us in how we live, serve, and love one another.
