Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that He has come not to abolish the law but to fulfill it. At first glance, the commandments may seem like rules imposed from the outside, rigid and demanding. But Jesus reveals that God's law is meant to guide our hearts, not merely our outward actions. He calls us to go deeper, showing that anger, contempt, or lust can be as destructive as visible sins. True obedience, Jesus teaches, is more than external compliance: it demands integrity, sincere reconciliation with others, and a purity of heart that aligns our desires with God's will.

This call can seem daunting, yet it is also a call to

true freedom. God's law is not a burden; it is a path to life and blessing, as we hear in Sirach and Psalm 119. By choosing love over anger, truth over deceit, and humility over pride, we open ourselves to the wisdom God offers through His Spirit. Living the law in this way transforms ordinary relationships—at home, at work, and in our communities—into opportunities for grace, healing, and deeper communion.

This week, let us reflect prayerfully on our hearts and our choices. Are we living the commandments only outwardly, or are we truly allowing God to shape the deepest intentions of our minds, words, and actions?

Lenten Observance for the Faithful

As we prepare our hearts for the sacred season of Lent, which begins on February 18, we are offering the following guidelines of Lenten observance to help the faithful enter more deeply into prayer, sacrifice, and conversion.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence, and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting applies to those between the ages of 18 and 59, unless prevented by health. On days of fast, one full meal is permitted, along with two smaller meals as needed to maintain strength. Eating between meals is not permitted, though fluids may be taken.

Abstinence from meat binds all who are 14 years of age and older, unless health prevents it. Meat is not to be consumed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. As a pastoral provision, Catholics may also choose to substitute special acts of charity or piety on Fridays of Lent. This observance is mandated by the Archbishop for the spiritual well-being of the faithful.

February 16 St. Juliana, Virgin and Martyr


St. Juliana of Nicomedia was a noblewoman who secretly embraced the Christian faith in the face of persecution. When her father arranged a marriage to a pagan man, she refused, insisting on her devotion to Christ. Denounced and arrested during the persecutions under Emperor Diocletian, she endured severe torture yet remained steadfast in her faith and consecrated virginity. Tradition holds that she triumphed over suffering and temptation before being martyred around 304 A.D.

St. Juliana reminds us that true fidelity to Christ often demands courage and self-sacrifice. She is especially invoked by those enduring illness or trials, showing that strength and faith can prevail even in the most difficult circumstances.
